FBI announces \$10,000 reward in search for Breasia Terrell

Federal agency has been involved from the start of the investigation

DAVENPORT, IOWA (July 22, 2020) — FBI Special Agent in Charge Kristi Johnson announced a \$10,000 reward Wednesday for anyone who has information that assists law enforcement in finding 10-year-old Breasia Terrell or leads to the arrest of anyone involved in her disappearance.

The award was announced as Johnson spoke at a media briefing about how FBI agents and their resources have been utilized since Breasia Terrell was first reported missing on July 10. Agents and personnel from Omaha headquarters and the Quad-City resident agency have participated in searches, reviewed cell phone records and provided other technical, investigative resources.

"Because of the nature of our work, many won't see the FBI working this investigation," Johnson said. "We've been here from the beginning, thanks to the commitment of our partner, the Davenport Police Department, to use all the resources available to them to find Breasia and bring the person responsible for her disappearance to justice."

Along with local and regional agents from Omaha, specialized agents from the Cellular Analysis Survey Team (CAST) have assisted in examining phone records, the Evidence Response Team (ERT) has been processing evidence and the Child Abduction Rapid Deployment (CARD) Team has and continues to provide investigative, technical, and resource assistance.

Anyone with information regarding the whereabouts of Henry Dinkins and his associated vehicles throughout the entire Quad-City metro area from 10 p.m. on July 9 to 12 p.m. on July 10 can call (563) 326-6125.
