The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program is a U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) program that was established to ensure that firms owned by minorities, women and other socially and economically disadvantaged persons have an equal opportunity to participate in federally assisted projects.

DBEs are for-profit small business concerns where socially and economically disadvantaged individuals own at least a 51% interest and also control management and daily business operations.

African Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, Asian-Pacific and Subcontinent Asian Americans, and women are presumed to be socially and economically disadvantaged.

Other individuals can also qualify as socially and economically disadvantaged on a case-by-case basis.

The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program is a U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) program that was established to ensure that firms owned by minorities, women and other socially and economically disadvantaged persons have an equal opportunity to participate in federally assisted projects.

To be regarded as economically disadvantaged, an individual must have a personal net worth that does not exceed \$1.32 million.

To be seen as a small business, a firm must meet the Small Business Administration size criteria AND have average annual gross receipts not to exceed \$23.98 million.

Size limits for the airport concessions DBE program are higher.

- 5.94% of all Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) contracts
- .15 % of all Federal Transit Administration (FTA) contracts

So how do you become a DBE? Well, it isn't simple; and it will take time.


To participate in the DBE program, a small business owned/controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals *must* receive DBE certification.


While the initial application is rather simple and straightforward, be aware that the entire process can be quite onerous. The process requires a lot of legwork and documentation.

For the State of Iowa, certification is achieved through the Iowa Uniform Certification Program (<u>UCP</u>).

When completing the form:

SAVE it to your desktop as you work on completing the entire application

DO NOT leave any blank answers, or it will kick back the application as unfinished, causing a delay

There are four steps of the application process:

- You must complete the UCP certification application and provide the required documents.
- 2. An audit of the documentation will be conducted to determine preliminary eligibility.
- 3. An on-site visit/review by a UCP Specialist will be performed to determine program compliance and eligibility.
- 4. Once eligibility is determined and all program requirements are met a certificate of participation will be issued.

In addition to providing consulting assistance, the Iowa DOT also holds an annual DBE workshop attended by certified DBE's, DOT staff, and other stakeholders.

The workshop provides a great networking opportunity with peer DBE's and with DOT and transit staff to learn about upcoming contracting opportunities.

The Iowa DOT DBE Directory

The Iowa DOT DBE directory lists each firm's name, address, phone number, fax number, e-mail, website, and the type of work it has been certified to perform (based on the North American Industry Classification System (or NAICS).

The NAICS has a unique code for every job type. For example, if you want to mine for gold you would receive Code 212221 and you would be joining 325 marketable businesses doing the same type of work.

The Iowa DOT DBE Directory

Businesses often have multiple NAICS codes assigned.

The directory is in real time with additions, removals, and changes in information being made as they are approved.

IMPORTANT!!! Inclusion in the Iowa DOT DBE directory does not constitute an endorsement of the firms listed. It is simply a list of all DBE's in the state.









The NAICS Codes

The predominance of DBE's in the State of Iowa are related to construction including, but not limited to, roads, bridges, etc. There are, however, other opportunities.


For example, CitiBus drivers, as do most of the transit drivers throughout the State of Iowa, wear uniforms. There are two codes for such uniforms: 424320 and 424330. One is for men's and children's and the other is for women's and children.

For anyone who sells uniforms to both, both NAICS codes are applicable.








The DBE Delimma!

The City of Davenport, and all transit systems in Iowa, are faced with the following:

There are no DBE's to purchase uniforms from and there are no DBE's to purchase fuel from.

Besides parts for vehicles, the majority which come from the original vehicle manufacturer, these are the two largest opportunities for DBE participation from CitiBus and most other transit operations.

This is why the Iowa DOT transit and the CitiBus goals are so low!



For systems like CitiBus that provide public transit and receive federal funding from the FTA there are generally a number of opportunities, as follows:

Fuel
Printing
Uniforms
Security Services
Cleaning Services
Cleaning Supplies
Business Supplies
Management Services
Transportation Services
Consumable Parts (for buses)

It is important to understand that not all of these opportunities are available at the same time; or even yearly.

For example, the City of Davenport just completed an RFP for paratransit services oneyear ago and this will be a five-year award.

Other opportunities, such as fuel and printing, could be available on a yearly basis.

Outside of the transit related activities, DBE's participate in a range of activities; from consulting to construction and from parking services to taxi services.

By checking the Iowa DOT DBE directory you can better understand where you might best compete in the DBE landscape.

Always remember your location compared to the "other company." There may be five DBE's providing "X" but if four are located in Florida, you might have only one real competitor.

Incidentally, it is important to understand that being a DBE does not guarantee selection in a competitive process. Therefore, anyone participating as a DBE must recognize that to be competitive, they must be cost competitive.

"Request to Bid" - with this type of opportunity the responsible and responsive company with the low bid will be awarded the contract.

"Request for Proposals" - with this type of opportunity an award might be made to an organization that is not the lowest bid based on other criteria.

Cost is always a major component of the selection process.

Finally, the City of Davenport annually participates in a small business and DBE workshop in conjunction with Iowa State University Extension Office.

The next workshop will be held on October 9, 2019. The location will be determined.
